Our Foundation's executive director, Laura Blankenship, and the Board of Directors join me in saluting all contributors for their generosity. Without them, none of this would have been possible.



DONOR RESTRICTED FUNDS

At the end of 2009, the Foundation was the steward of \$1,019,179 in assets. 76% of this year-end fund balance was in restricted funds that had been given by donors for specific purposes.

These restricted funds fell into three categories.

- Thirty-two funds are dedicated at the donor's request for the needs of a hospital department, project or program. These funds are available but as yet not requested by the hospital.
- Six funds are for hospital equipment and projects which were approved but not yet disbursed by the end of the year.
- Three are endowment funds in which the principal is permanently invested, and all or a portion of the income is withdrawn for granting annually. Each fund is established and administered according to a donor's wish and Foundation policy and procedure.

The WGHF Endowment accepts contributions from any source with 100% of the income distributed annually for hospital needs.

The Sebo Endowment is being gifted by Robert & June Sebo from their life estate with 90% of the income available to be distributed annually at the discretion of the Board of Directors, after a principal balance of \$500,000 is achieved.

The IES Endowment was established in 2009 by Island Employment Services, a community organization which provided employment support for the disabled for 29 years. 100% of the fund's income may be distributed annually to create or sustain employment opportunities for persons with disabilities at the hospital or in Whidbey Island community-based healthcare settings.

The Finance/Investment Committee of the Board of Directors monitors all Foundation funds, restricted or unrestricted, making periodic investment recommendations to the Board of Directors.


