



### Working together

The Hospital identified one of their key organizational values as innovation. An Employee Innovation Team was formed in early 2010 to identify a project that would involve collaboration at all levels of the Hospital.

The project chosen was to tackle a long-standing problem. Small children regularly spent hours in the Emergency Department waiting room. There was no designated area or toys or activities to engage them. Parents distracted by the larger medical crisis which brought them to the hospital were often not able to consistently supervise their children's noise and activity levels. This affected all those within range, including the triage and registration staff, as well as other patients waiting to be seen and those accompanying them

The Team worked with parents, staff from a dozen WGH departments and volunteers to develop a safe play area with educational toys and activities for children ages 2-10. Foundation donors joined community donors, lverson Insurance Agency and Mark's Automotive Repair to fund the toys, furniture and activities for the play area.

Innovation, collaboration and philanthropy are a winning combination!

#### **ONGOING ENDOWMENT BEQUEST**

Thirty years ago the spark that flamed the passion to create the Whidbey General Hospital Foundation was ignited by one man's imagination, namely Bernard "Bud" Waterman. Bud, with his wife, Margaret, opened the Waterman Mill Company in 1950. The mill successfully operated in Langley under the Waterman name for 40 years.

Bud Waterman believed that "If you live in a community, you have to support it to the extent

that you can." These were not just words, but a commitment that Mr. and Mrs. Waterman guaranteed by setting up, in trust, the Waterman Medical Foundation to contribute its annual investment income to Whidbey General and Providence Hospital foundations.

The Whidbey General Hospital Foundation was established in 1981 following Mr. Waterman's death to receive the trust's ongoing contributions. In the



years following her husband's death Margaret Waterman built her own legacy of philanthropy in the South Whidbey community until her passing in 2010. Their children carry on their legacy, playing a significant role in the management of the trust and its semi-annual disbursements.



The Waterman Medical Foundation has contributed nearly a million dollars to the Whidbey General Hospital Foundation over the last three decades. Its support has been the bedrock upon which the Foundation has grown. We humbly remember and honor the Watermans for their love of community and incredible generosity.

### Tour de Whidbey

The Foundation's annual fundraising bicycle event, Tour de Whidbey, targets the purchase of equipment for the Hospital as its goal every year. In 2010, it was a state-of-the-art digital urology endoscopy system.

The dismal weather the few weeks leading up to the event was a concern, since historically over half the riders register the morning of the ride. That Saturday the wind buffeted riders and volunteers, blew canopies and signs away, but the sun was out!

424 bicyclists rode 10, 30, 40, 50, 60 and 100 mile routes. Nearly 150 volunteers made it happen for them. After expenses the Tour exceeded its \$50,000 commitment toward the equipment by \$14,000, and was able to contribute toward the purchase of other equipment for the Hospital.

#### The secret to our success:

- The stupendous support of our sponsors and contributors who step up to ensure we achieve our fundraising goal.
- Our fantastic volunteers who came out for the 9th year to staff the breakstations, pancake breakfast & chili feeds, to put up & take down route signs, mark the pavement directions for riders and to monitor the routes.
- The congenial and appreciative bicyclists who travel from all over the United States and Canada to ride scenic Whidbey Island.

### Giving for the future

Sebo is a well-known name in the grocery and hardware business on Whidbey Island. Bob Sebo opened his first store here in 1962. Over the next 27 years, he put down deep roots here, raising his four children here, burying his first wife Joan here and building thriving businesses here. In 2006 he and his wife June made a decision to focus their philanthropy here. Their first gifts were focused on the purchase of digital mammography equipment to honor the memory of Joan Sebo, who passed away in 1980 from cancer.

In 2008 they established the Robert and June Sebo Endowment Fund at the Foundation, with the intention of contributing up to six million dollars through ongoing gifts during their lifetimes and from their final estate. The Sebos chose to establish an endowment because endowments permanently restrict the use of principal; only a agreed upon portion of the accrued investment income is withdrawn. Thus, their endowment can provide for the needs of the Whidbey General Hospital into the future.

Donors wishing to invest in our community's healthcare future have several endowment options. They may establish their own named endowment fund, like the Sebos, contribute to another established fund, or choose to contribute to the Foundation's existing WGHF Endowment. 

The Foundation financial records are audited annually by an independent certified public accountant.


The financial information contained in this annual report reflects the financial position and activities reviewed in the audit report for 2010, which had no findings.
